

Prior to the event opening, John Milliken, Southern California Region Director, did a live "on-air" interview with CBS/KCAL9 at their Studio City newsroom location. During the interview, John did an excellent job advertising the event as well as promoting our CCCA/SoCal club while discussing two of our Classic cars we brought to the studio.

The massive South Hall of the Convention Center was filled to capacity with more than 600 antique, Classic and retro cars. Every car had an assigned space and despite the large number, the entry and exit process of all those cars went relatively smoothly. The crown jewel of the show was the Grand Boulevard, a spacious area down the center of the South Hall devoted to showcasing 50 special and unique vehicles. These cars were chosen to span the last 100 years of automotive history and were lined up chronologically down the Grand Boulevard. Fifteen of these 50 cars were owned by members of the CCCA-Southern California Region and were outstanding examples of 1920s, 1930s, and 1940s era cars.

Beyond the Grand Boulevard, there were more than 50 car clubs displaying their finest automobiles, including the Cadillac & LaSalle Club of SoCal, Great Automobiles of Yesteryear, the Alfa Romeo Owners, Ford Thunderbirds and Jaguars Owners, just to name a few.
