A call came.


We want your Phantom I.

We have used Envirotech's DriWash N'Guard for many years and the entire body came clean in about 20 to 30 minutes. Good stuff. I did fudge on the chassis and used a hose to rinse all the tight fittings, cables, parts and pieces.

The first day we filled the gas tank five times and used half a crankcase of oil. The car is fine. The driver did not do so well. He, (that's me) from all the double clutching (affecting my left leg, knee and hip, right arm and shoulder) came out in need of Melaleuca's Pain-a-trate. Then, I too, will be on the mend and the 'ole Phantom will again look great for holiday events, two weddings, and of course, Starbuck's mornings.
